

CARL PERKINS GRANT

The Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Technical Education Act of 2006 (Perkins IV), which took effect in Program Year (PY) 2007 (beginning July 1, 2007), is the principal source of federal funding to states for the improvement of secondary and postsecondary career and technical education programs.

The GMCS schools that are participating in this grant during the 2017 - 2018 school year are: Crownpoint High School, Gallup High School, Miyamura High School, Navajo Pine High School, Ramah High School, Tohatchi High School, Thoreau High School and Tse' Yi' Gai High School.

This grant provides career and technical education to accomplish the following Objectives:

- Establish programs of study for high demand/high paying jobs
- Establish a course sequence of study that supports programs of study
- Prepare students for the work force with employability credentials
- Collaborate with associate's and bachelor's programs for students to pursue careers
