McKinley Academy is proud to initiate our first student ambassador program this year. The intent for the student ambassadors is to foster leaders within the program, students homeschool, and community. We aim to have the student ambassadors be the face and voice of the McKinley Academy program while providing opportunities for the ambassadors to gain valuable leadership skills and ramp up their resumes for colleges. The application process was competitive and yielded many strong applicants. After interviewing each applicant, 23 final student ambassadors were selected, representing most of the homeschools the program services. In addition, to serving as

student ambassadors, 19 ambassadors also volunteered to be a mentor to a new McKinley Academy student who joined the program in the second semester. As mentors they meet with their mentee weekly to check in on the student and be a friendly face the student knows they can go to with questions or any issues they may encounter. To top it off, most of the ambassadors are also highly involved in clubs at UNM-G's campus, such as Multi-Media

Club, Asian Club, and UNM Student Senate. Additionally, many of the ambassadors participate in clubs at their homeschool including NHS, Key Club, MESA, and several sports.

So far, the ambassadors have helped with events occurring at McKinley Academy including campus tours, new student orientations, parent nights, and presentations at other GMCS schools. A few ambassadors have worked on initiatives they believe will benefit students in the program, including a UNM-G Nursing Bridge program, Reading Buddy program, student-led yearbook specific to the Academy, proposals for a music program, and organizing special events for students to attend.
